OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The Sub-Fund, expressed in Euro, aims to generate a positive return, measured in Euro, defined as a mix of income and capital growth. It will invest in a global flexible diversified portfolio consisting primarily of equities, fixed-interest and floating rate securities, non-investment grade securities, currencies and cash.

The Sub-fund will invest in equities and equity related securities that may benefit from global long-term market themes resulting from changes in economic and social factors such as demographics, lifestyle, technology, safety and security, health and wellbeing, regulations or environment.

The Sub-Fund may invest:

- Up to 100% of its net assets in fixed interest and floating rate securities;
- Up to 80% of its net asset value in equities instruments, including depositary receipts (such as American depository receipts "ADRs", European depository receipts "EDRs" and global depository receipts "GDRs");
- Up to 30% of its net assets in government bonds, corporate bonds (investment grade and non-investment grade) and equity instruments issued by entities located in emerging markets;
- Up to 20% of its net assets in non-investment grade debt securities (including those issued by emerging markets issuers);
- Up to 20% (cumulatively) in asset backed securities ("ABS") and mortgage backed securities ("MBS");
- Up to 20% of its net assets in units/shares of UCITS and/or other UCIs including UCITS compliant exchange traded funds ("ETF") which provide exposure to the above mentioned asset classes;

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE

- Developing market risk: the Sub-Fund is exposed to securities highly sensitive to political and economic instability of developing countries such as civil conflicts, changes in government policies and in taxation, currency fluctuations and other developments in the laws and regulations of countries in which investments may be made. Price changes may be higher than those in the markets of developed countries.
- Investing in the People's Republic of China (PRC) is subject to the risks of investing in emerging markets and additional risks, which are specific to the PRC market. In case of investment in

China A shares and in debt securities issued by Mainland China issuers, where securities are held in custody on a cross-border basis, there are specific legal/beneficial ownership risks linked to compulsory requirements of the local central securities depositories.

- Coco risk: investments in CoCos may expose the Sub-Fund to different risks, the main ones being: Unknown risk, Conversion risk, Write down, Trigger event, Coupon Cancellation, Call extension risk, Capital structure inversion risk, Yield/Valuation risk, Industry concentration risk (as described in the SICAV's Prospectus).
- Liquidity risk: the Sub-Fund invests in markets that can be characterized by a reduced possibility to exchange securities without a negative impact on prices.
- **Regulatory risk:** risk that regulation changes (in particular in respect of securitizations and contingent convertible bonds) may negatively impact the Sub-Fund in respect of market prices and liquidity.


